FULL PRIORITY - a third year evening student who bid 1 pt for an on-curriculum evening subject, such as Succession, wins over: a. any day student; or b. any evening student who is not in 3rd year who bid 300 points for the same section	REGULAR - the system counts the points he bid as is, and can "win" a section insofar as his/her bid is higher than that of others, subject to the "Full Priority" rule.	x2 - the system automatically doubles the points s/he bids for; so if a student bid 30 points on an applicable section, the system will count his/her bid as 60 points; in the same example, an off-curriculum student who bid 65 points will win the subject over the said student who actually bid 30 points but which was counted as 60 points.	x1.5 - the system automatically doubles the points s/he bids for; so if a student bid 30 points on an applicable section, the system will count his/her bid as 45 points; in the same example, an off-curriculum student who bid 50 points will win the subject over the said student who actually bid 30 points but which was counted as 45 points.	REGULAR - the system counts the points he bid as is, and can "win" a section insofar as his/her bid is higher than that of others, subject to the "Full Priority" rule.	FULL PRIORITY - a fourth year evening student during the second semester, a fourth year day student in any semester, and a fifth year evening student in any semester who bid 1 point for an elective will win over any third year, second year, or first year student who bid 300 points for the same section	REGULAR - the system counts the points he bid as is, and can "win" a section insofar as his/her bid is higher than that of others, subject to the "Full Priority" rule.

NOTE:

On-Curriculum means a student taking a subject which the curriculum states s/he must take at the said semester. Ex. Property is On-Curriculum for all sophomore students during the first semester of their second year, but during the same semester and academic year Sales is On-Curriculum only for day sophomore students and NOT for evening sophomore students, while Legal Theory is On-curriculum only for evening sophomore

students and NOT for day sophomore students.
